From the Pastor's Desk

It is getting to that time of year again. October is passed, and the Fall bounty is coming in. I know my tomatoes are slowing down. Still have 9 on the vine as of this writing. So, the plants are finishing strong even though we had an odd growing season. Our thoughts turn to reflection on the year with Thanksgiving on our door step. It is my hope for you all that you see the year of 2025 as a year with many things to be thankful for. That said I would like to put down a two-level challenge for you. I plan on doing this as well.

I would like us all to try to come up with something unique to be thankful for that we did not use in a prior day in November. So, starting November 1st, and every day till November 30th, find a different thing to be thankful for. Now I said there is two levels to this and you can choose at any time to start in on the 2nd level (you don't have to start on the 1st of November!). The 2nd level is to find an additional thing that you are thankful and still not repeat any one thing. And you can even try a 3rd tier to this if you are brave and thoughtful enough, because I think that the more, we find things to be thankful for the more we realize we have many more things to be thankful for. In other words, our thankfulness should multiply as we go through the month.

The best thing to do here if you do not blog or journal is to get a sheet of paper and put it on your refrigerator and everyday record the 'unique' thing you are thankful for, so you can keep track. I will do you one better and provide a half a page in this newsletter to do this. See on next page...

Why do this? It is more than exercise of frustration; it is my hope to bring us closer to the heart of God. In 1st Thess 5 as a part of 'final instructions' to the church of Thessalonica, Paul wrote this as encouragement.

"And we urge you, brothers and sisters, warn those who are idle and disruptive, encourage the disheartened, help the weak, be patient with everyone. Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always strive to do what is good for each other and for everyone else. Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. Do not quench the Spirit. Do not treat prophecies with contempt but test them all; hold on to what is good, reject every kind of evil. May God himself, the God of peace, sanctify you through and through. May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do it."

I love all the 'instruction' in this. But being Thankful always is smackdab in this middle of this list of advice for the church. The words Thanks or Thankfulness or the phrase "give thanks" is listed over 220 times in the Bible it is an important theme run throughout the various books. There is never much instruction on how to be thankful, but it seems that it is telling us that it is a mindset that we need to have. And it also tells us of our position with God. That is one of Thankfulness, for all the good that we get and have gotten. Over and over in the Psalms it says to be Thankful to God for many things. Philippians tells to include an attitude of Thankfulness in our prayers. Thessalonians though imparts on us the need to just be Thankful.

Thankfulness is a powerful and can bring many benefits to our lives daily. It is linked to increased happiness, improved physical and mental health, greater self-esteem, and life satisfaction. Regular practice of thankfulness can lead to long-term positive changes in the brain, supporting mental health and resilience. Simple exercises like keeping a gratitude journal can improve mood, increase empathy, and strengthen social bonds. This is why I think that we should practice this November the art of "Giving Thanks Always."

Blessings to you all this Thanksgiving and Advent season, and for some, see you in 2026!

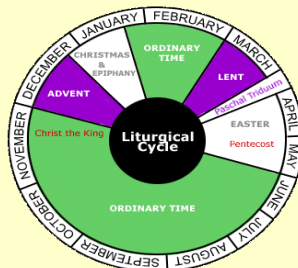

The Mobility Cart can also prevent other health problems. There are three Mobility Worldwide affiliate in Michigan. They are MI – East Michigan (Goodrich), Michigan - Saline and MI – West (Holland). ++++++FINANCE++++++

The two endowments are doing well. We are using the funds that are available for needs, seminars, new books, and for buying and updating the church's building's needs. New phone lines, new handicapped door, new carpeting and flooring, new freezer, computers, etc.

As of September 30,

General Endowment is \$462,695.04

Smith Endowment is \$344,801.39

Without the use of these endowments, we would not be able to do much more than the budgeted expenses.

The two CDs are doing ok. They are both for 6 months. We use the interest generated to purchase higher CDs. One cd is \$53,000 at 4.1% interest. Matures on 10/30/25. The second cd is \$55,000 at 4.3% interest matures on 2/4/26. There has been a \$8,000 gain since purchasing both.

We will begin to work on the 2026 budget within the next two months. New Giving Envelopes for 2026 will be here within the next month or so.

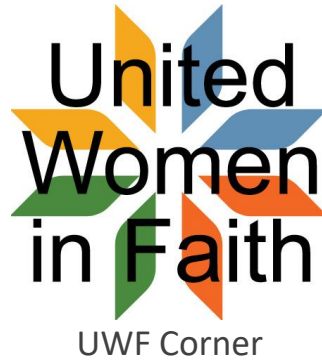
